Model it

If you want your child to show respect, you also have to do it. They look up to you so show them how it is done.



Teach it

Give them the tools they need to be respectful. For example, teach them what being respectful means and why it is important.



Discuss it

When you see another child being respectful, or even disrespectful point it out and talk about it. This is a visual for children to put with the word respect and what it means.



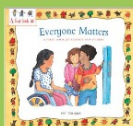
Praise it

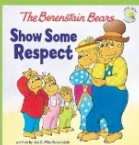

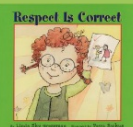
